Dear Landowner:

You are receiving this letter because you are a registered landowner along the Brunswick Pipeline Right-of-Way, a natural gas pipeline owned by Emera New Brunswick.

We work hard to operate the pipeline safely and securely. As a landowner along the Brunswick Pipeline, you too can help us keep the pipeline safe: When planning any ground disturbance activities near the pipeline, please call **1-888-410-2220** or go to **clickbeforeyoudig.com** at least three (3) days in advance of the planned activity.

Obtaining Brunswick Pipeline approval prior to beginning ground disturbance activities is not just a courtesy – it is the law and a requirement of the National Energy Board (NEB), Brunswick Pipeline's regulator. The NEB may impose fines on landowners or companies for unauthorized activities near a pipeline. As a reminder, the following activities require prior approval from Brunswick Pipeline:

- Constructing a facility across, along, upon or under the pipeline or its easement;
- Using power-operated equipment or explosives to excavate near the pipeline;
- Conducting any activity on the easement, or within 30 meters of the pipeline, that disturbs more than 30 cm (12 inches) of ground below the initial grade, and/or reduces the total cover over the pipe; or
- Crossing the easement with heavy equipment.

Please note this list is not exhaustive. If you are in doubt about permissible activities, please call 1-888-410-2220 or go to clickbeforeyoudig.com.

Emera New Brunswick is committed to ongoing landowner engagement. That is why we will be contacting landowners periodically to discuss pipeline safety and to review the information you are receiving today. You can also provide feedback directly by providing your comments or questions about pipeline safety on the enclosed postage-paid feedback card.

Our database of owner names and information is compiled from the Provincial land registry. We are aware that this registry does not always contain the most current information. Please complete and return the contact information sheet if there has
